TOPSFIELD RESIDENT, PEABODY ATTORNEY TO SERVE AS SECRETARY OF THE MASSACHUSETTS BAR ASSOCIATION

Attorney Robert L. Holloway Jr. has been elected secretary of the Massachusetts Bar Association for the 2007-08 year, beginning on Sept. 1. Holloway is a shareholder and president of MacLean Holloway Doherty Ardiff & Morse PC in Peabody. He resides in Topsfield.

He is a long-term member of the Massachusetts Bar Association Ethics Committee, a member and past chair of the MBA's Civil Litigation Section Council and a former regional delegate to the MBA House of Delegates. In addition, Holloway received the MBA's Community Service Award in 1993 and has served on the Joint Bar Committee on Judicial Nominations for six years. Holloway received his B.A. from Amherst College in 1968 and went on to earn his J.D. from Boston University School of Law in 1973.

Holloway regularly volunteers as a judge for moot court arguments at Boston University School of Law and Harvard Law School and as a trial advisor in the Harvard Trial Workshop program. He is also a regular panelist on continuing legal education programs, including the recurring MCLE program, "How To Try A Civil Case In Superior Court." Holloway is an emeritus member of the Board of Editors of *Massachusetts Lawyers Weekly*, having served on that board since 1981. He is also a past president of the Essex County Bar Association.

Holloway has served as a member of the Town of Topsfield Board of Health and as an elected representative to the Masconomet Regional School Committee from 1990 to 1999. For many years he was the director of the Topsfield Athletic Association and also served as the organization's president for a time. Prior to that, he served as an appointed member and chair of the Danvers Recreation Committee. He was a founding member of Hospice of the North Shore and served for many years as a corporator of Beverly Hospital.

Alongside Holloway, the other 2007-08 MBA officers include: David W. White Jr., president, Boston; Edward W. McIntyre, president-elect, Clinton; Denise Squillante, vice president, Fall River; Robert F. Lucas, vice president, Wakefield; and Valerie A. Yarashus, treasurer, Boston.
